FIREARMS 10.01

ST. GERMAIN 01/01/02

10.01 PROHIBITED ACTS. No handguns, whether holstered, cased or uncased, shall be worn on a person or otherwise carried while such person is inside a public building or place of business including, but not limited to, places of business which are licensed for the sale of alcohol or fermented malt beverages.

10.02 EXCEPTIONS. This chapter shall not apply to the following:

(1) A sheriff, deputy sheriff, warden, constable, U.S. marshal, State trooper, police officer or other law enforcement officer.

(2) The maintenance and use of supervised rifle or pistol ranges or shooting galleries or firearm, rifle or handgun safety courses.

(3) Display of unloaded firearms, rifles or handguns in public or private premises.

(4) The carrying other than on the person, display or possession of firearms, including rifles and handguns, for purposes of sale in places of business properly licensed and engaged in the business of the sale of firearms.

10.03 CONFLICT AND SEPARABILITY. (1) CONFLICT OF PROVISIONS. If the provisions of the different sections of this chapter conflict with or contravene each other, the provisions of each section shall prevail as to all matters and questions arising out of the subject matter of such section.

(2) SEPARABILITY OF CHAPTER PROVISIONS. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this chapter is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by reason of any decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of any other section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase or portion thereof. The Board hereby declares that it would have passed this chapter and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases or portions may be declared invalid or unconstitutional.
